

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Report any potential campus hazard, that could cause personal injury, to Campus Police.

ACTION STEPS

CHECK the scene for safety - don't approach if unsafe

CALL 9-1-1*

CARE for the patient

- Assist the patient if it is safe for you to do so - and you have had proper training
- Get the AED (Automated External Defibrillator) if needed
- Control bleeding (direct pressure and elevating the injured body part)
- Treat for shock - (If they are unconscious, feel faint or seem to have a change in mental acuity)
 - Lie the patient down unless it will cause more harm
 - Maintain a normal body temperature by warming or cooling
 - Do Not give the patient anything to eat or drink

*Call 9-1-1 For ANY emergency that appears life threatening such as:

- Bleeding that cannot be controlled
- Chest Pain
- Difficulty breathing, or no breathing
- Difficulty speaking, slurred speech or loss of control of one side of the body
- Loss of consciousness or change in level of consciousness
- Seizures (note the number and duration of the seizures for medics)
- Severe burns

**Note: You can always call back to cancel if the situation changes.
It's best to get the responders started just in case.**
